Featured Active Campaign

Addressing Food Insecurity with World Food Movement

At Chabot College, we recognize student success begins with meeting basic needs. Many of our students face food insecurity, which creates barriers to their academic journey. Under the Student Equity Office, the Gladiator Resource Hub is partnering with the **World Food Movement** (WFM), a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting community colleges by providing free, hot, vegetarian meals for students in need.

The team served **1,200 nutritious, freshly prepared meals** at Chabot in just the initial month of service and strives to scale-up in the future months based on needs of the students and availability. HMC Architects

Chabot's collaboration with HMC Architects and their Designing Futures Foundation (DFF) has been a model public-private industry partnership. Beginning in 2019,



DFF funded scholarships for Chabot Architecture students. Soon thereafter, their support extended to funding tours of architecture programs at 4-year universities.

In the past several years, the partnership has deepened with HMC Architects' employees serving as judges during students' final project critiques and hosting Chabot students as interns. As a result, other architecture firms now host Chabot student interns.

This leveling-up of the Chabot
Architecture Program has resulted in a
high transfer rate for Chabot
Architecture students to prestigious
universities like UC Berkeley, Cal Poly San
Luis Obispo, and UCLA. Chabot students
have also garnered significant scholarship
awards, including a \$39,000 annual
scholarship to UC Berkeley.

Mary Ann Downey Nursing Scholarship

Mary Ann Downey was a nurse and healthcare professional for her entire life. After graduating high school, Mary Ann entered the nursing program at Ball Memorial Hospital in Muncie, Indiana. After three years of instruction, she graduated and received her diploma as a Registered Nurse in 1961.

Mary Ann moved to California in the sixties and worked as an RN while continuing her education by enrolling in the nursing program at Chabot College. She then received her AA Degree in Nursing in 1979. After graduation, Mary Ann earned a BSN, a PHN certificate, and an MS degree in Mental Health Counseling. She worked in healthcare until she was 80 years old. Her husband, James Griffith, continues her legacy by supporting future nurses at Chabot College through generous scholarships.





On May 2nd, the Friends of Chabot, Office of Student Life, and Student Senate hosted the Annual Scholarship Luncheon. In 2014, the foundation began by awarding five scholarships. Since then, the scholarship program has grown leaps and bounds.

This year, we received scholarship applications from 554 students and awarded \$94,800 in scholarships to 89 Chabot students. This also marked the launch of the inaugural President's Leadership Institute, with nine students in the first cohort.



Impact of Emergency Aid

Emergency aid continues to make a difference! Since Fall 2020, the Friends of Chabot College has distributed emergency aid awards in the form of direct cash grants. The Chabot Office of Research, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness has provided the following snapshot of academic year 2024-25 emergency aid recipients.




Who received emergency aid?









Emergency aid reached a higher proportion of Latinx, African American/Black, and Asian American students, closely mirroring the demographics of Chabot's student body.

Persistence

The chart below shows the persistence rate of students who received emergency aid and either enrolled at Chabot the following semester or received a degree/certificate. Students receiving emergency aid in 2024-25 had an 83% persistence rate, which is higher than students who did not receive emergency aid.



Course Success

Successful course completion generally refers to passing a course with a grade "C" or better. The chart below shows **students who received emergency aid in 2024-25 had a 78% course success rate, which is higher than students who did not receive emergency aid.**

Recently Awarded Grants

Over the past year, the Grant Development Office supported project leads to submit over 35 competitive grant proposals, with more than \$8 million in funding awarded in support of Chabot students and programs. Select recently awarded grants are highlighted below.

Altamont Education Advisory Board

Supports Chabot College Zero Waste Initiative Implementation Pilot Project to promote waste prevention and recycling, job training and education, and compliance with Senate Bill 1382 (organics separation).

→ \$40,000 over 1 year.

California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Foster Youth College Access Demonstration Project

Supports the college to serve local feeder high schools students, with experience in foster care after the age of 13, through a case management model to lower barriers to college enrollment and promote postsecondary success.

→ \$180,000 over 2 years.

Foundation for California Community Colleges Wellness Coach Designated Education Program

Supports developing and implementing a designated education program for California's new Certified Wellness Coach profession, which aims to address mental health challenges for children and youth by training Certified Wellness Coaches to provide care to young people through prevention and early intervention services.

→ \$200,000 over 3 year.

California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Rising Scholars Network

Supports Chabot's Restorative Integrated Self-Education (RISE) Program to provide comprehensive services - such as career advising, peer mentoring, and case management - for currently and formerly incarcerated/systems-impacted individuals.

→ \$438,357 over 3 years.

California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Rebuilding Nursing Infrastructure

Supports Chabot's Nursing Program to address critical gaps in nursing education by expanding clinical placement opportunities, enhancing faculty recruitment and retention, and improving student success outcomes.

 \rightarrow \$1,500,000 over 2 years.

Kaiser Permanente Community Benefit Program

Supports expanding enrollment in the Chabot Fresh Success Employment and Training (E&T) Program, providing participants with case management, career workshops, and support services to promote career education program completion and increase earning capacity.

→ \$25,000 over 1 year.

Foundation for California Community Colleges Chabot Program Pathways Mapper

Supports the sustainability of Program Pathways Mapper - an innovative tool to help students plan and streamline academic coursework through an easy-to-use roadmap.

 \rightarrow \$60,000 over 3 years.

Foundation for California Community Colleges, Nursing Education Investment Fund 2025

Supports developing a Nursing Summer Bridge Program and Summer Faculty Onboarding Session - targeted interventions designed to help students and faculty have a start strong.

→ \$179,238 over 2 years.

Sutter Health Community Health Investment

Expands individualized post-secondary planning and onboarding activities delivered directly to Mt. Eden and San Lorenzo High School seniors, particularly students who are non A-G (university) eligible. Also supports Medical Assisting pipeline development.

→ \$80,000 over 8 years.

US Department of Education TRIO Student Support Services Teacher Prep

Supports comprehensive academic supports, proactive counseling/advising, career exploration, financial aid education, individualized transfer supports, and economic and financial literacy services to address barriers SSS Teacher Prep eligible students face.

→ \$972,500 over 5 years.

US Department of Education TRIO Student Support Services Aspire

Supports comprehensive academic supports, proactive counseling/advising, career exploration, financial aid education, individualized transfer supports, and economic and financial literacy services for eligible TRIO SSS Aspire students.

 \rightarrow \$1,430,545 over 5 years.

US Department of Education TRIO Student Support Services Excel

Supports comprehensive academic and English language supports, proactive counseling/advising, career exploration, financial aid education, individualized transfer supports, and economic and financial literacy services for TRIO SSS Excel students.

 \rightarrow \$1,361,820 over 5 years.

US Department of Education TRIO Student Support Services STEM

Supports comprehensive academic supports, proactive counseling/advising, career exploration, financial aid education, individualized transfer supports, and economic and financial literacy services to address barriers SSS STEM eligible students face.

Grant Projects at Work

MESA, TRIO Talent Search, and Hayward Promise Neighborhoods: Summer Workshop Recap

Chabot Mathematics Engineering Science Achievement (MESA), TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS), and Hayward Promise Neighborhoods (HPN) teamed up to provide incoming target students with workshops to help them prepare for a successful start to the fall semester. This summer, 39 students participated in a College 101 workshop and campus tours led by MESA students.

36 new incoming STEM majors and continuing MESA students joined: a success visioning activity, mapping out their semester; mentoring from an amazing team of STEM students, who also facilitated an engineering design challenge to see who could keep a parachute floating the longest; tours of the STEM Center; and graphing calculator check-outs for the semester.







High School & Middle School Field Trips

This March, Chabot College hosted campus visits in collaboration with TRIO Educational Talent Search and Hayward Promise Neighborhoods. Students from Cesar Chavez Middle School, San Lorenzo High School, Brenkwitz High School, and Bret Harte Middle School participated in the visits. They toured the STEM center, obtained student IDs, explored dual enrollment opportunities, and received guidance to help them navigate their college journey.

Chabot #1 in State for ZTC Grant Awards!

The Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) Program supports the California Community College system in building degree and certificate pathways that eliminate or drastically reduce textbook costs. The goal is to lower the cost of education and help students complete programs faster without the burden of textbook costs. So far, the State Chancellor's Office has awarded \$95.7M statewide to 115 community colleges. Chabot ranked #1 in the state with \$2.8M! These grants will support ~14 ZTC degree/certificate pathways and 10 additional courses with 80+ faculty leading projects.

From Fall 2024 to Spring 2025, first-time transfer-seeking students who enrolled in at least one ZTC section achieved a 78% persistence rate, notably higher than the 56% persistence rate for their peers in non-ZTC sections. Among low-income students, the persistence rate was 82%, in contrast to just

58% for those not enrolled in a ZTC section.



Michelson 20MM Grant has Statewide Impact

Through a \$25,000 grant from Michelson 20MM Foundation, the Chabot College Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) team, in partnership with the Academic Senate for California Community College Open Educational Resources Initiative (ASCCC OERI), worked with 7 California community colleges to create and pilot ZTC data dashboards, as well as share the dashboard template statewide.

Across the 7 pilot colleges, over 100,000 students enrolled in the Fall 2024 semester. This means at least 100,000 students have, and will continue to be benefitted by the newly built dashboards created through this project.

Ultimately, the goal is to impact all 2 million+ students in the California Community College system by engendering better data access and critically thinking about the impact of

OER implementation. Access to data allows for better resource allocation, discovering equity gaps to eliminate, and continued positive student impact regarding student success outcomes.

"The new OER Dashboard will save me at least 40 hours a semester as the OER Coordinator. Instead of crawling through the online schedule and inputting the data into an Excel file, I can now quickly search, locate gaps and uses, and identify ZTC Pathways."
